
Children's Animal Shelter Project

REFLECTIONS

WAY OF LOVE Follow-Up

What an exciting and inspiring Way of Love Revival on October 26th at the Expo Center in Appleton! The Presiding Bishop offered a dynamic and meaningful exhortation to all of us to practice the Way of Love in our daily lives, in our churches, and in our national life.

So, what do we do now? And, even more, what about those of us who were unable to go? How do we do follow-through and follow-up to keep the spirit of the Revival at work in our lives and here at St. Peter's?

Watch for more announcements on activities at St. Peter's as we continue our growth in The Way of Love. In the coming months, we will have learning and sharing events to continue and to expand our faith journey in The Way of Love.

A WORD FROM THE RECTOR

For those of us who were able to go to the Way of Love Revival on October 26th in Appleton, we all would agree that the experience was spiritually spectacular. The energy in the crowd was powerful. The music was dynamic (more about that in a moment). We heard moving testimonies of faith from six very different people of all ages and cultures. We had funny moments led by a young tech wizard. Lunch together was delightful. Most importantly, Presiding Bishop Michael Curry was stirring in his call to live out the Way of Love in following



Jesus Christ.

The day gave me so much to reflect upon and pray through as a Christian, and as your priest here at St. Peter's. How can I, and your fellow parishioners and leaders, put to work the call to love as Jesus loves us? How can we share our spiritual story in ways that introduce people to Jesus Christ, and invite them to be a part of our life here at St. Peter's? How can we strengthen our worship experience? What is the mission to which we are called in Sheboygan County and beyond?

Or, as any great spiritual experience offers us, *What now? What next?*" Let me offer three thoughts to get you started.

Use the Way of Love spiritual discipline in your life. There are seven segments to the Way of Love. The best patterns in life are tied to a useful number. As children, we learned five responsibilities (to match the five fingers on one hand). Or, as an old country music song says, "The only things I can count on are the fingers on my hand." The seven pieces of the Way of Love can be tied to the seven days of the week. The seven parts of the Way of Love are: Turn, Learn, Pray, Worship, Bless, Go, and Rest. These steps don't have to fall in exact order, but they do match very well the rhythm of the days of the week, and have a connection to the first seven prayers in the Book of Common Prayer section of "Various Collects", pp. 251-52. Consider how these seven parts of the Way of Love can bring order and direction into your spiritual life.

Develop your Christian story. At the Revival, six different people (and our bishop was the seventh), told of ways in which God had become real in their lives, and how they had found blessing and encouragement. At the clergy conference back in September, the speaker stressed the same point: learn to tell The Story in your story. I will be very ready to help you to develop this spiritual asset in your life, and ways in which you can share, with whom, and at what point. Each of us is on a spiritual journey, with unique and special moments and events that can speak to others—especially others who are deep in a search for meaning and direction in their lives. We will offer more opportunities to share stories also on Sunday mornings as a part of our worship time.

Grow St. Peter's Episcopal Church, your parish community. We have plenty of room to welcome people into our worship and work as a community of faith. On Sunday mornings, we can look at pews that are empty and say, "Where have all the people gone? How are we going to make it?" OR, we can say (from the Holy Spirit's perspective), "Who are the people I can bring here to discover the real presence of Jesus Christ? O God, guide me to the people who are ready to come with us and grow in faith!" Which direction will bring growth? Which direction will reflect how God can be glorified? Each of us has a circle of influence and a network of relationships. Ask God to lead you to the people who are waiting to be invited by you to experience worship and life here.

In the end, the Revival may have been an event. But it also is a process, and it is a way to set the Spirit of God into motion. Let the Way of Love be our Christian pattern of life. May the Revival be the match that re-lights the fire of God's love in our church, and in our hearts.
